

# **Annual Activity Report 2013**

#### Introduction

Women in Action Worldwide is a non-profit organization established on 11th November 2012 in Geneva, whose aim is to encourage the socio-economic empowerment of women across the world through a travel guidebook collection.

The purpose of this collection is to enable the reader to discover a country through the voice and the vision of women.

With the aid of sponsors and volunteers, the association was able to launch the first phase of project: the collection of the prime information and the interviews of women in Tanzania. Carin Salerno, co-founder of WAW, moved to Myanmar in August 2013.

## Project Tanzania the world of women

**The concept:** to discover a country through the voice and visions of the women who live there.

## Why a collection that focuses on women?

Travel literature often neglects the realities of women. The knowledge of the visited countries comes mainly through presentations, analysis and interpretations that ignore women's reality.

This collection is an essential complementary addition to the existing travel guides and enables a more complete view of a country's reality.

This idea has met with a very positive response of a large public in Switzerland and abroad.

#### First step: collecting material

After a period of planning based on Carin Salerno's wide international and Tanzanian network, Carin Salerno and Elisabeth Thorens found public and private funding. Thus, they were able to travel to Tanzania in April 2013.

They visited four regions of the country and collected several life stories, photos and pictures. Elisabeth and Carin got a very enthusiastic welcome from the Tanzanian women, their companies as well as from various governmental, non-governmental and international organisations. The launching of the book Tanzania is already planned at the Alliance Française in Dar es Salaam in Spring 2015 with the support of the Swiss embassy, Swiss International Airlines, local companies and organisations. This event is very much looked forward to by the women themselves who were interviewed. In response to the request of all the interviewed women, a special version of the book will be published in Swahili, to reach out to all Tanzanian women and men who want to be inspired by role models.

#### Second step: producing a prototype of the book

Since May 2013 the WAW team has been working on the Tanzanian book prototype: research, writing and editing, working on the graphic design, contacts with possible editors, international experts, writers and translators. The team hopes to finish the prototype by the end of 2014. Most of the contributions towards the book were either offered at a reduced

price or even free of charge. We should like to thank everybody for their precious help and support

## Third step: printing, distribution and promotion of the prototype

The team is now looking for a publisher to coedit the prototype Tanzania. The publishing in French and English is planned for the first half of 2015, a version in Swahili will follow in the latter half of 2015 to satisfy the demand of the Tanzanian women.

#### Creation of the Internet site of the WAW association
